Instructors and participants	Qualified Instructor must ensure that the group participants wear masks at all times when foils are in their hands. Masks to be put on before picking up foils. The Instructor is to maintain group control and ensure the safety rules are reinforced and stop bout(s) immediately if someone removes their face mask.	3	1	3			
FEN	Equipment failure	Bruising, minor cuts and scrapes and possible damage to the eyes.	Instructors and participants	All equipment has a pre-use check before the session and monthly recorded inspections. All equipment to be correctly stored away and cleaned if necessary.	3	1	3			

FEN	Uncontrolled bouts: Foil being waved around excessively, resulting in a whipping action.	Participants getting over excited and could lead to a serious injury. Could lead to cuts, bruises, lacerations, and possible broken bones.	Instructors and participants	Qualified Instructor to maintain control of all participants at all times. Clear safety briefing is given at the start of the session and is in line with the Standard Operating Procedures. Foil(s) to be removed from participants if it is felt that they would cause harm to anybody. In rare circumstances exclusion from the activity if it is felt appropriate.	2	3	6		
FEN	Unauthorised person entering the session area.	Cuts, bruises and lacerations and possible damage to the face and body due to lack of PPE	Any visiting people	Qualified Instructor to maintain vigilant at all times. The Instructor to control access to the session area and be aware of other guests on site. Instructor to set appropriate boundaries to control where the participants are permitted during the session.	3	1	3		
FEN	Unattended foils	Cuts, bruises and lacerations and damage to the face and body due to lack of PPE	Instructors, participants and wondering guests	Ensure foils are put away securely in their storage bag when the session is not in progress.
